

How Can I Support the NC Governor's School?

As individuals who have been impacted by your experience as a Governor's School student, you may wish to use your voice to support the program in the future. Here are ways you can be an advocate for the Governor's School:

Share your Governor's School experience with teachers and administrators of your school. A letter to your guidance counselor, principal, superintendent, and school board chair would be welcomed.

Send thank-you notes to the individuals who recommended you for Governor's School.

Write a letter to the editor of your local newspaper in support of Governor's School.

When you return to school in August, speak to your guidance counselors about Governor's School information meetings and offer to help by sharing your experience with prospective students.

Contact members of the North Carolina General Assembly to thank them for your Governor's School experience and to encourage their support for the FULL FUNDING of Governor's School in the state budget in the future. It is most effective to contact the individuals who represent YOU rather than all representatives.
